



He also brought a wooden piece that was an exercise in ornamental carving, which he then bleached white and finished with a water based varnish.

Jim Roby shared several carvings...a white tailed deer head from butternut which took a bit of extra work as he had turned the deer's head slightly, a very realistic replica of his daughter's little dog, two Christmas ornaments in a box carved in Fredericksburg last Spring, and also a carved teakwood elephant he had purchased in Thailand in the 60's.

Buddy Streetman had carved a polar bear from a Debbie Edwards blank and had bleached the basswood over a period of time until it was white. Buddy also shared a bison he had carved in Debbie Edwards class.

Tony Novak brought a bandsawed/ woodworked giraffe he had made, with a bit of history behind it. He said that in 1958 he was returning to the states from a tour in Germany and he had bought several sheets of German plywood to build footlocker type crates to ship thing home in. He had some of the plywood left over so he glued pieces of the plywood sheets together and then band-sawed the giraffe out of the finished product, which made a most interesting piece to display.

As you can see, each carving represented the skills, interests, and much time invested by the carver. Good job one and all.

Following the raffle drawing, carvers gathered around tables to carve the little fox pins brought by **Fred Hartman** for the blank of the month. A fun and relaxed way to end the evening.
