

### **Secretary's Notes**

There were some 30 in attendance at our October monthly meeting which met at Woodcraft. President, **Buddy Streetman**, called the meeting to order. Two visitors, **Joe Hill**, and **David Hickey**'s son, **Patrick**, were welcomed.

Gail Lynn reported that the By-Laws Committee had met, reviewed, and updated the By-Laws of our association, a copy of which had been provided our members through the newsletter for their review prior to the October meeting. Gail made the motion that the amended By-Laws be approved, seconded by Jim Brinkman. This motion was carried unanimously.

**Jo Cage** presented the Nomination Committee's recommendation of the following slate of officers to serve for one year beginning December 1, 2004. The Vice President shall also serve as the president-elect, and will serve as president at the end of the current president's term.

Johnny Dunlop announced that he will be responsible for publicity during the upcoming year, promoting wood carving, and activities of our association, in and around the Austin area. A second table had to be brought in to accommodate the carvings for Show and Tell, mostly as a result of our recent week in Fredericksburg.

Our members brought home a flock of ribbons this year. Jim Roby's elk took 3rd place, and his deer head placed 1st. Jaleen Vance entered her lovely shallow relief carving which she had skillfully painted, which won 1st place. Buddy Streetman won 3rd place for his power carved stylized dolphin with the inlaid turquoise. His bleached basswood polar bear from a Debbe Edwards blank, won 1st place, and he also brought his shoe display

with tiny work, golf, and dress shoes. Buddy's mountain man and his buffalo head both won Honorable Mention. **Dwight Vance**'s walking cane placed 1st. His comment ... that would be his first and only walking cane. **Marvin Joseph**'s caricature carpenter with the nail in his bleeding thumb brought a 1st place. His cowboy placed 2nd, and he also brought his bison carved from butternut and his power carved cat stylized car from cherrywood. **Jake Heugel** won 1st place with his lion head which also brought a Merit Award. His elk, which was scaled to 3/4 size of **Jim Roby**'s elk, brought 2nd place. **Diann Small** brought her very detailed walking canes, one of which took 2nd place and one took 3rd place.

Did our carvers do good in the Fredericksburg competitions or what?!!!

But there was more to see. Jo Comer had finished a tiny horse necklace, and also the sea captain from Jim Brinkman's blank. Sue Sweeney brought a finished bark carving she had begun in Fredericksburg which was most impressive. Jo Cage brought the little angel ornament, our blank of the month last month, which she had carved and painted most attractively. Rita Ryser brought the two bark carvings she had done in Bill Williams' class, and also a lovely basswood chip carved momento box with an oil finish. Shirley Newman brought a caricature Santa with a bag of toys, a little dachshund dog, and a hand holding a cross carved from one piece of wood, done during the week in Fredericksburg.

Hats off to all the carvers, and a big thanks for sharing!

**Rita Ryser** brought a long piece of cottonwood bark which she received from Jim Miner in Fredericksburg. Volunteers from wood carving clubs interested in bark carving will carve on this bark which will then be auctioned off at the meeting in Fredericksburg next September. Several of our group will participate in this project.

Two Patty Rucker DVDs were purchased and placed in our Library for use by our club members.

A raffle was held with several interesting items going to the lucky winners. The blank of the month provided by **Ed Jones**, a two-sided clown head with a smiling face on one side and a frowning face on the other, caught the eye of club members for carving.

Jim Brinkman and Bob Hrehor volunteered for "set up/clean up" duty in October and had our area ready for us when we arrived. Those signing up for this responsibility for the November 9th meeting are Bill Buckler, Fred Hartman, and Stuart Dattner.
