August 10 2004 Meeting

Several items of business were introduced including the necessity of reviewing our present by-laws, responsibilities of the Advisory Board and Club Officers, special presentations during our monthly meetings, mission objectives and goals throughout the year, carving demonstrations by members during local events during the year to make our club more visible, and nomination of officers for 2005.

A motion was made by **Jim Brinkman**, seconded by **Jo Cage**, that a *By-Laws Committee* be appointed to review our present by-laws, and recommend a more applicable set of by-laws to our Club. The motion passed with a unanimous vote of the membership. A committee was selected made up of **Gail Lynn**, **Jim Brinkman**, **Diann Small**, **Jo Cage**, and **Marvin Joseph**.

A *Nominating Committee* was also selected, consisting of **Jo Cage**, **Jean Johnson**, and **Jim Roby**, who will present nominations for new officers for 2005.

Two new members were welcomed into our Club Tuesday night, **Thomas** and **Priscilla Jefferys-McCarthy**. Also, we were glad to have **Laura Haguewood**, **Robert Snider's** daughter, visiting and carving with us during the evening.

When you think of September ... what comes to mind? How about the *Texas Woodcarvers Guild Fall Roundup and Show* in Fredericksburg September 20 -25! We will have one more Tuesday night meeting on September 14 before the Roundup, but here are some items of interest regarding activities during the week in Fredericksburg.

• **Diann Small** placed a sign-up sheet on the table for anyone who will be available to stay at our table in Fredericksburg for a 2-hour period during the Show on Friday and Saturday. Contact Diann if you are able to help out in this way.

• Club members are encouraged to bring a favorite carving to place on our table so our Club will be duly represented. Carvings can be brought to our September meeting, or carvers may bring their work during the week in Fredericksburg to be placed on display.

• **Gail Lynn** will take the table, tablecloth, our Club sign etc. to Fredericksburg to be set up for the Show. A helping hand setting everthing up Thursday evening will be appreciated.

• **Diann Small** announced that this year each table (either club or individual) will be given a gold ribbon. Members of the Club will have the option of selecting one carving from their table to be given this gold ribbon. The Peoples Choice Award will then be chosen by vote from among one of the carvings bearing gold ribbons.

An interesting Show and Tell time followed the above business items, and included the following:

Jean Johnson brought two very delicate dove carvings in the fantail style. This is a unique carving technique carved from the core or heart of white cedar which is wet and chilled before being carved. The resulting carvings were lovely!

Gail Lynn had surgery on both wrists a few weeks ago and carving was a bit of a challenge, so she got out the paints and finished several of her previous carvings. Those she brought to share were a turtle on a log, a horned toad, caricature carvings of an "ugly lady", a "Forty-Niner", a "cowboy", a "bust of John Kerry", and a decorated wooden spoon. Good work, Gail.

Jo Cage brought the sea captain she had carved from a blank provided by (and under the eagle eye of) **Jim Brinkman**, one of the wooden spoons with the little balls carved freely into the handle, and the fox pins which were blank of the month last month. Jo is really getting the hang of "face" carving ... good job, Jo.

Laura Haguewood, Robert Snider's daughter who was visiting him, shared a small western lady's boot, with a hand sign for "I Love You" on the side of the boot, and also a much smaller little boot. Laura is an artist in her own right, but is new to carving, so it was special not only to have her visiting with us, but also to see the results of her carving skills.

Jake Heugel had carved a Polar Bear which was white because of the bleaching technique he applied. Great carving and impressive finish, Jake.

Bob Hrehor shared the reclining doe with it's head turned, which he had carved from one piece of wood, painted and mounted. Very realistic, and well done, Bob.

Tony Novak brought a religious figure he had purchased on a trip to the Canary Islands. He also had a collection of stylized birds he had carved from Zebra wood with wires for feet and magnets in the base to hold the birds in place. A unique wood resulting in very attractive little birds.

Shirley Newman brought the Santa ornament in a box, and tiny horned toad, she had carved in Fredericksburg in April, and painted before new undertakings in Fredericksburg come September.

Diann Small brought two angels she had carved and painted. These will be our blank of the month in September. Looks like fun, Diann.

Club members moved to the tables where **Bob Hrehor** instructed them in carving (very carefully I might add) flowers from wood. Not only chips ... but little petals fell to the floor during the learning process, but what a fun evening, and a challenging new carving experience for all. Thanks, Bob.

Now, temperatures cooled a bit briefly in August, children returned to the classroom, football is in the air, and we are anticipating another interesting meeting September 14. See you then.
