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



Secretary's Notes February 14, 2006 Meeting by Shirley Newman

We had a room full of carvers at our February monthly meeting. Looks like the months are already beginning to click by this year as we look forward to spring, and upcoming woodcarving events.

A warm welcome was extended by Bill Buckler to three new members, John Woods, Eric Moore and Sean Moore. Our ranks are growing!

Bill reminded club members to bring their dues current, and also reminded us of the box set out each meeting night for the Bereavement Fund. Jim Roby, Treasurer, stated that he was considering moving our club account to another financial institution because of fees we are currently being charged.

Congratulations were extended to Johanne Morin who has a piece of her work on display at the Austin Airport. If you are traveling ... be sure to take a moment to view it.

Jim Roby gave an overview of the class led by Walter Wharton January 20-21, held at the Optimist Club, stating that 13 carvers were present. He was

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pleased with both the dmonstrations and the individual guidance of the instructor. Jo Cage also added that Walter was a very good teacher, and took time to help each carver.

Johnny Dunlap read another creative poem he had written highlighting the driving skills (or not) of Jake Heugel while at the Rally on the Rio event. Want to know more? If so, you can email Johnny for a copy of the poem.

More carving classes are upcoming, including a 2-day class led by Dallas Degee scheduled for the weekend of April 1 and 2 at a cost of \$70.00 plus the roughout, and a 3-day class led by Steve Prescott in mid-May at a cost of \$100.00 Ten people have signed up for each class with one or two alternates on the waiting list should an opening occur. Additionally, Debbie Edwards will be here for a class the second week of February, 2007. All carving classes will be held at the Optimist Club, 505 Ferguson Drive, in Austin.

The Operation Cane project is still on hold. Several have signed up to participate and more information will be shared when available.

Bill Buckler looked into several group carving opportunities, one of which will be at Pioneer Farms from 1:00 to 5:00 on Sunday, February 26. This may become a monthly event the last Sunday of each month. Another carving opportunity will be Frontier Days in Round Rock the 4th of July weekend, with more info to follow on this.

And, the Texas Woodcarvers Guild Spring Roiund Up will be held April 24 to 30 at the Gillespie County Fair Grounds in Fredericksburg. Many of our group have already signed up for classes, and it always proves to be a high moment of the year.

By time for show and tell, the table was full to overflowing with many different pieces of work. Dottie Dunlap brought a woodburned image of Christ which she displayed on a roughly hewn cross with a chip carved base. She also had completed the deep relief carving with a scenic bridge, and a see through area in the back where stained glass can be mounted as an added highlight. Although this type relief is often done with power tools, Dottie did it all by hand. And Dottie also brought her spirit face, and her mouse house carved in bark.

Jo Cage had completed the standing bear which was last month's blank provided by Gail Lynn, and also the bear with his head resting on a log which she completed in Walter Wharton's class.

Buddy Streetman brought his Indian bust which he finished with a bronzed look. He will contribute this piece to the Silent Auction held at his High School Reunion which will go toward a fund benefitting students.

Clarence Born brought his whimsical gnome, a chicken caricature carved for a niece, and two of the standing bears from Gail Lynn blanks.

Jim Roby brought the tiger head he carved in Walter Wharton's class, and true to form he also shared the moose under attack by four wolves, mounted on a mahogany base. Most impressive.



Jake Heugel brought his fox head from a Dee Gipson blank which was most realistic, and also a goose egg with two little bear cubs scuffling inside. He had also whittled a bear head pen.
