

Diann Small noted that Walter Wharton is interested in leading our club in a class featuring the giraffe wood carving, and Rick Jenson is interested in leading our group in another 4-day class.

Clarence Born gave special recognition and appreciation to Dan Gillen for the excellent work he does in preparing our monthly newsletter, and also maintaining our club website. He presented Dan with a \$50 gift certificate as an expression of our appreciation.

Jim Roby reminded club members that he has business cards we can distribute to interested carvers noting our carving times and location.

Jim Roby had stained a cowboy bust he had previously carved, and also woodburned and painted the fox he carved from a Debbe Edwards blank.

Clarence Campbell had stained a carving he had completed of a rabbit. while in Glen Rose.
